Dear Friends,

Jesus was talking to his disciples, but he was also thinking about anyone willing to stay close and connected. If we do that, we most certainly will grow and bear fruit.

So here we are... ready to grow again! We will be one new congregation by January 1st. Not only will we be bringing two congregations together, but also discovering who we are in this new time. We will be digging deep into our roots to reflect on our PURPOSE as God's church together.

Those roots feed the tree trunk - a strong image for a congregation's core Beliefs. These beliefs stand firm against even the most powerful of storms. There will be seasons with more or less growth. Like the rings on the trunk of a tree, the faith of the community is always central.

I am filled with joy and anticipation as we journey in faith together! Once we have a stronger sense of who we are, we can give words to how God is calling us in mission. Then, we will come together to rename the church that is being made new by a God who has chosen us for such a time as this! Please join us for worship this July, and play an important role how we move forward together.

The month of June holds space for communities across the country who have been historically marginalized to celebrate stories of liberation and freedom. These celebrations echo the stories from our faith about the Lord who

May Christ continue to heal us and make us whole - and we are more whole - when the whole body of Christ is loved, supported, and celebrated.




## PRAYER STATION IN SANCTUARY



### FEEDING HUNGRY KIDS 2022

FEEDING HUNGRY KIDS is a program to feed neighborhood children during five of the six weeks Oshkosh Area School District Food Service closes. We realize some families do not have the structure or funds to offer enough food to their children. Our pro-

gram seeks to nourish children by giving them food, activities, and community that results in a feeling of acceptance and love.

The last two years, we prepared bags with items to help with breakfast, lunch and dinner. This was due to COVID which is still an issue. We do not fit the criteria for FEEDING AMERICA, so this year we will not be receiving food from the Oshkosh Area Pantry. Obviously, this limits what we can offer, however, we feel we will definitely make a difference.


Again this year, members from First Presbyterian of Oshkosh will be teaming up with us. Besides volunteers, their monetary contribution will allow us to offer socks, underwear and hopefully, tennis shoes. These items will be offered to those children that attend and sign up during the first three weeks of our program. We will be shopping at Jake's Network of Hope for these items, which costs us 20% of retail. Last year, this was the highlight of the program. The joy shown in the children s faces, along with the thank yous we received from parents proved how important this donation was to the families. New shoes for gym or everyday! First English Lutheran and St. Andrews Lutheran both will be running the program as well.

We have spoken with those in the know at Oaklawn Elementary School and have decided on three locations: Edison Estates Mobile Home Park, Logan Avenue Apartments and Lakeview Mobile Home Park.
